Philosophy, Politics, and Economics (PPE)

Interdisciplinary Minor

- » PPE is an interdisciplinary program that offers an *integrated* approach to the study of philosophy, politics, and economics.
- » The first PPE curriculum was established at Oxford University in the 1920s as a means of equipping students for leading roles in the public sector, industry, and journalism.
- » PPE brings together intersecting and overlapping disciplinary perspectives relative to wealth, power, and the common good, examining issues of collective concern as both practical and moral questions.
- » PPE draws from a rich tradition of conceptual and methodological pluralism in the social sciences and humanities.
- » PPE scholars evaluate the ethical and political dimensions of economic phenomena, as well as the way that politics is shaped by economic practices and normative commitments.

As a PPE minor, you will...

- » integrate and apply knowledge of philosophy, politics, and economics to the study of complex and contested 'real world' issues.
- » engage in focused multi-disciplinary learning oriented to critical reflection and problem solving.
- » examine diverse perspectives on key concepts, institutions, and values that are fundamental to political and economic life, including: power, order, and authority; democracy and collective action; property, markets, production, and exchange; individual motivation and behavior; freedom, equality, and justice.
- » engage multiple methodologies utilized in research across the social sciences and humanities.
- » build a foundation for leadership by fostering practical and ethical reasoning and thoughtful deliberation about complex and multi-dimensional issues of public policy.
- » develop a set of conceptual tools, analytical lenses, and evaluative logics that can be used to understand and assess the world around you.
