In 1982, with the creation of Scott Plaza, the landscaping for the building would be altered too. Formally a parking lot, the most prominent feature of the garden is the Fonville Fountain. Constructed in 1982, a gift from Rudy M. Fonville and Frances Turner Fonville, class of 1928. The garden features many traditional plants that would be in a southern style garden.

A southern garden features many vibrant plants that display colors year-round. Plants discovered here would be found in most subtropical southern style garden locations. The camellias bloom throughout winter, azaleas and dogwoods in the spring, and four seasonal flower beds provide color year-round.
