

Founders Grove

Elon University's Founders Day first occurred in 1939 and continued sporadically throughout the following decades. In 2004, a committee was formed to bring the event back annually with a week of festivities relating to the history of Elon. During the week of celebration, a tree was planted in honor of someone influential in Elon's history. This became known as the Founders Grove. The Founder's Grove is a collection of 16 White Oaks (*Quercus alba*) located in the Lambert Academic Village quad.

A White Oak is the absolute king of the forest, this native towers over the other oaks in size, age, and beauty. The oaks open crown and wide-spreading branches reveal its distinctive, scaly gray bark. Although hard to transplant and slow growing, the White Oak will reach more than 100 feet in height and will easily last a century. This White Oak was likely presence when Elon University was founded and has inspired Elon's logo.
