Data Nexus Community of Practice

This COP will focus on the data needs of faculty and staff to engage students in teaching, learning, and research. Not sure what data to integrate into your class or perhaps you collect data in class or as part of your research but want to integrate basic data analytics methodology or technology. Then this Community of Practice (COP) is for you.

Some ideas for sessions, which will be chosen based on the population, include (1) what data should I integrate? (2) sentiment analysis (3) understanding hypothesis testing (4) basic R or python data visualization & interpretation.

Help Shape Qualitative Research Training for Students

Qualitative research plays a pivotal role in understanding complex phenomena within social settings, offering depth that quantitative methods alone may miss. At Elon University, our Qualitative Methods course (ANT 2150/SOC 2150) is essential for sociology and anthropology majors but is challenging to accommodate for all interested students. Many of our students who pursue undergraduate research engage in qualitative research. With funding from an Elon Innovates grant, I am developing training sessions to teach qualitative methods outside the classroom. Your feedback is crucial in shaping these sessions, which aim to launch in Spring 2025.

Data Intensive Courses

Faculty Grants

Data Nexus grants support small-scale data-initiatives designed to enhance student engagement and learning or professional development opportunities to advance your own teaching practice. Grants can be used for:

 course-related student engagement, and can be used to fund materials or experiences for data-intensive engaged learning, or

Information and Application

• individual, group, or departmental professional development for data-intensive pedagogy (group or departmental professional development might include funding for a reading group, online workshop, for example)

Small grants of up to \$1000 support start-up and one-time expenses (materials, stipends, workshops, and so on), but do not cover ongoing operational costs. The Data Nexus Director is also willing to consult with you about other sources of possible funding for ongoing projects.

Student Grants

Small grants of up to \$500 support one-time student expenses (registration fees, materials, and so on), but are not funded through other sources.
