Founded in 1889, with a tragic fire in 1923, Elon has truly risen from the ashes. With more than 7,000 students and 70 majors, Elon fosters a community of hands-on experiences founded in the traditional liberal arts curriculum with an emphasis on global experiences and career development.





The university follows a 4-1-4 schedule where students take four classes in the fall, one class in January, and four classes in the spring. This allows students increased flexibility to study abroad, take extra classes, or extend an internship.


Outside of the classroom, Elon requires students to participate in **experiential learning** requirements consisting of study abroad, internship, research, leadership, and service learning.
