African Diaspora LLC Learning Outcomes

- Students will participate in Center for Race, Ethnicity, and Diversity Education activities, in addition to community specific programming, while living among other dedicated students with a similar interest in racial identity, and the reaches and depth of the African Diaspora.
- Students will develop a connection with faculty, staff, and students associated with the Center for Race, Ethnicity, and Diversity Education, the African and African American Studies at Elon Minor and other related departments.
- Students will be exposed to and participate in various activities that will assist in personal self-assessment, exploration of community and global issues relating to the African Diaspora, service learning and team building.
- Students will enhance their learning through intentional connections between living learning community programming, their service through the CREDE, and co-curricular interactions with Elon faculty and staff.

Expectations of African Diaspora LLC members

- ❖ Attend LLC meetings and activities and contribute to the community. **Active participation is required!**
- ♦ Abide by the Elon University Honor Code & Code of Conduct.
- Respect the needs of each of the residents (studying, sleep, hygiene).

- Residents of the African Diaspora Living Learning Community are expected to take at least one course aligned with the African and African-American Studies Minor at Elon University during Winter Term 2022 or the Spring Semester 2023. Failure to do so, may prohibit one from being able to return as a resident of the African Diaspora Living Learning Community for the following year.
- The LLC will be informed by principles of Nguvu and Huduma (Swahili for service and leadership).
- New and/or returning students living in the African Diaspora Living Learning Community must participate in the Spring Project which includes the attendance of all mandatory meetings and completion of required project and reflection in the Spring of 2023.

The Ubuntu Academy of the African Diaspora Living Learning Community

The Ubuntu Academy is designed to create the opportunity for each student of the African Diaspora Living Learning Community to further explore academic concepts related to race, ethnicity and Blackness through meaningful engagement of the African Diaspora. Ubuntu is the Nguni Bantu term for "humanity," often associated with the proverb "I am because we are." First year residents will build a foundation of knowledge regarding cultivating their own spaces of Afrocentric education, while returning residents will focus on implementation of the previous knowledge through preparation of a special hall project in partnership with the libraries.

The goals of the program are as follows:

- Participants will explore the diversity and interconnectedness of Black communities within the African Diaspora
- Participants will explore Black racial identity development
- Participants will explore connections between Black identity and research
- Participants will identify an ELR project to work with for the duration of the Spring 2023 semester

Looking Back To Move Forward Fall Project

This "Looking back to move forward" project is an opportunity for the members of the African Diaspora LLC to engage in intentional reflection around identity, belonging, and creating space through a lens of Sankofa. The process will involve the student engaging in deep reflection about their "being" on Elon's. Focusing on aspirational capital, we will leverage the power of storytelling to deconstruct how they currently see themselves in the world and reconstruct who they believe they will be in the future.

The goals of the project are as follows:

- Participants will explore the diversity and interconnectedness of Black communities within the African Diaspora
- Participants will explore Black racial identity development
- Participants will be able to critically examine their sense of self and belonging on Elon's campus
- Participants will create an artistic piece of expression that exemplifies who they are and their sense of self **

Projected Dates of Milestones:

- October 1st Ubuntu Academy Reflection
- November 1st Submit artistic pieces
