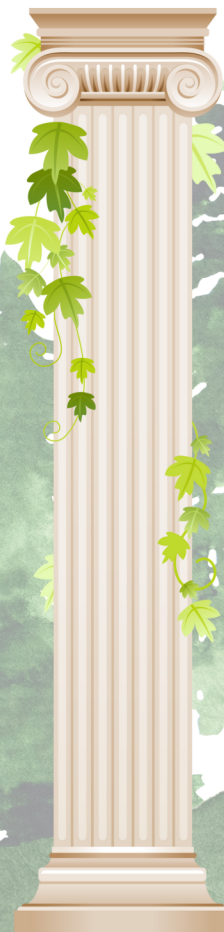
NEIGHBORHOOD THEME

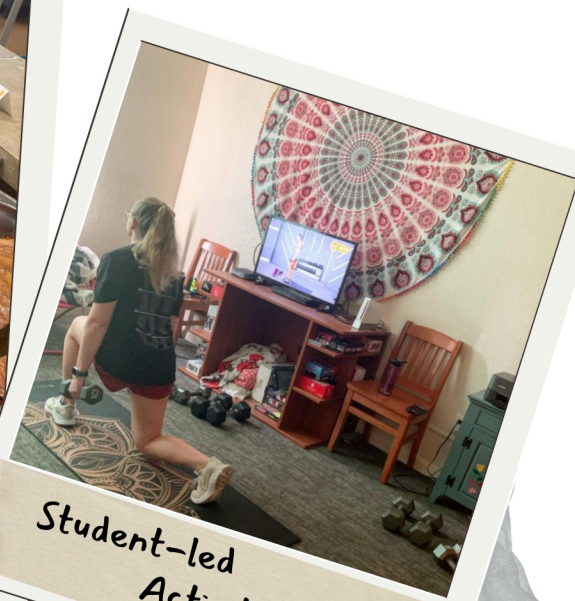


TRADITIONS AND ACTIVITIES

NEIGHBORHOOD FEATURES

The Oaks and Park Place Neighborhood provides housing for over 700 student-residents, including sophomores (30%), juniors (49%), and seniors (21%). Apartment style housing is spread out across seven buildings and include a mix of floor plans that can accommodate two-to-four residents, each with a full kitchen and in-unit laundry. The neighborhood shares McCoy Commons Club Room (with a full kitchen, TV, vending machines) which backs onto a large activity space that includes a partially covered patio, gas firepit, charcoal grill, sand volleyball, and basketball court.

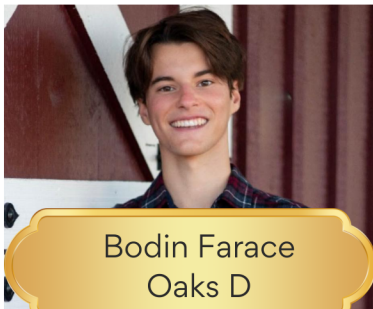
