
Sustainable Living Learning Community Syllabus 2024-2025

The Sustainable Living Learning Community (SLLC) at Elon University, located on the first floor of Kivette in the Colonnades Neighborhood, provides a dedicated space for students to explore sustainability topics and their individual roles in addressing sustainability challenges. Through monthly discussions and active participation in campus and community events, students will expand their knowledge of the environmental, social, and economic impacts of individual actions, as well as explore the systemic changes needed to address the climate crisis.



The SLLC aims to foster a deeper understanding of sustainability and its intersections with social justice.

Students will have the opportunity to develop their personal definition of sustainability and gain insights into how sustainability practices can contribute to a more equitable and just society.

Within the SLLC, students will benefit from the support and guidance of their peers and mentors. Through this network, they will be empowered to make informed choices and cultivate impactful habits in their personal lives. By encouraging critical thinking, the SLLC will equip students with the knowledge and skills necessary to address sustainability challenges and contribute to a more sustainable future.

Goals of the community are:

- 1. Foster a sense of community among students by organizing engaging activities, group discussions, and collaborative projects that center around sustainable living.
- 2. Promote critical thinking and awareness about sustainability by organizing field trips, screening documentaries, and facilitating discussions that encourage students to explore and analyze pressing environmental issues.
- 3. Empower students to embrace sustainability in their personal and professional lives by cultivating a supportive environment that holds each other accountable to high standards of sustainable practices and behavior.
- 4. Facilitate connections for students to both on- and off-campus sustainability opportunities to provide hands-on experiences that deepen their understanding of sustainability and its real-world applications.

Engaged students will:

- Apply systems thinking to sustainability issues: Students will develop a comprehensive understanding of the interconnectedness of environmental, social, and economic systems, enabling them to analyze sustainability challenges holistically.
- **Adopt three new sustainable habits**: Students will actively seek to incorporate sustainable habits into their daily lives, such as reducing single-use plastic consumption, practicing energy conservation, implementing responsible waste management, or adopting sustainable transportation options. By setting specific goals, students will contribute to their personal sustainability journey.
- **Form connections with peers and hold each other accountable**: Students will build meaningful connections with their peers within the learning community, creating a supportive network to encourage and hold each other accountable for sustainable behaviors. This peer support system will foster a culture of sustainability and motivate students to maintain their commitments to sustainable living.
- Increase sustainable behaviors through peer influence: Students will actively engage in discussions, share knowledge, and exchange experiences related to sustainability, inspiring and motivating each other to increase their sustainable behaviors. By leveraging the power of peer influence, students will collectively drive positive change and foster a culture of sustainability within and beyond the learning community.

Expectations for students in the sustainable living learning community at Elon University:

- Adopt at least three new behaviors that support sustainable living: Students are expected to actively incorporate sustainable practices into their daily lives. This may include reducing waste, conserving energy and water, utilizing sustainable transportation options, supporting local and organic food sources, or engaging in responsible consumer choices.
- Participate in campus-wide sustainability initiatives: Students are
 encouraged to actively engage in sustainability-focused events and initiatives
 organized by the university, such as Earth Week, Don't Trash It, or other campuswide sustainability activities. By participating, students contribute to creating a
 more sustainable campus community.
- **Attend the monthly SLLC meeting**: Students are expected to attend the regular meetings of the sustainable living learning community. These meetings provide a platform for sharing ideas, updates, and opportunities related to sustainability, and offer a space for collaboration and collective decision-making.
- Participate in at least one SLLC experience each month: Students are
 encouraged to actively engage in at least one experience or activity organized by
 the sustainable living learning community each month. These experiences may
 include workshops, field trips, guest speaker events, service projects, or other
 sustainability-focused activities that enhance their learning and practical
 engagement with sustainability topics.

By fulfilling these expectations, students will actively contribute to the development of a sustainable living learning community and demonstrate their commitment to sustainable living both within and beyond the campus environment.
