LLC Description

The Paideia: Politics and Active Citizenship Living Learning Community (Paideia LLC) is a hub for students interested in political engagement. This LLC provides opportunities for campus involvement and leadership in civic engagement, and provides a space for the discussion of local, state, national, and global political issues.

Paideia is the place to be for politically active and interested students. It offers the chance to connect with issues and the community. Paideia also provides a place for you to discuss, debate, and learn from your peers as we as a community navigate the fast-paced events unfolding around us.

LLC Student Learning Outcomes:

Living-Learning Communities (LLCs) provide students with a sense of belonging in a community of their peers united by a common interest. By engaging in this LLC, students will:

1. Participate in intellectual, personal, and social growth activities within a collaborative and integrative (academic, social, and residential) environment.
2. Apply academic, professional, social, cultural, and/or wellness skills/knowledge through experiences, reflection, and synthesis outside of the classroom.
3. Participate in mentoring relationships with faculty, staff, and/or peers outside of the classroom.

Paideia-Specific Learning Outcomes

- Students will expand their civic knowledge through events and programs, regular meetings for discussion, and the active monitoring of campus, city, state, national and global events.

- Students will learn how we as a community can practice civility and bipartisanship even when we disagree on issues.
- Students will have the chance to actively connect what they learn in the classroom with life on campus, and in our local community, state, nation, and world.
- Students will have the opportunity to experience together through discussion, reflection, and action the fast-paced events that characterize the America of 2025.
- Students will develop essential skills for civic and political engagement and learn how citizens get involved on the local, state, national, and international level.
- Students will think about ways in which academic learning translates into active citizenship.

- Participation in campus deliberative dialogue events
