

The <u>Sustainability Faculty Scholars Program</u> identifies, supports, and recognizes faculty who are interested in incorporating or enhancing a focus on sustainability, broadly defined, in their teaching. By the end of the 2024-2025 academic year, each participant will have successfully integrated sustainability into one course in their academic discipline, and they will receive \$1,000 for completing all requirements in the program.

The 2024-2025 cohort of Sustainability Faculty Scholars are required to attend four workshops. The workshops are designed to deepen understanding of sustainability, prompt critical reflection on curriculum and pedagogy, and foster a dynamic professional learning community. There will also be opportunities to collaborate with and be mentored by previous Sustainability Faculty Scholars at other gatherings and events.

Applicants are encouraged to consider sustainability broadly, including the most common pillars of environmental, social, and economic sustainability, as well as the <u>United Nations Sustainable</u> <u>Development Goals</u>. Interest in the intersections of sustainability and social justice is also welcome, including topics such as environmental racism and climate literacy.

Letters of application should be emailed to Scott Morrison, Faculty Fellow for Sustainability, by **5:00 pm on Friday, October 25th**. Permanent, full-time faculty from every discipline are invited to apply. The Sustainability Faculty Scholars Program is committed to inclusive excellence.
