

## SUSTAINABLE BUILDING HIGHLIGHTS

used regional building materials and products with recycled content

85% of construction waste was diverted from the landfill



installed lowflow toilets, shower heads, and other plumbing fixtures

Elon's Green Building Policy (2009) specifies new buildings exceeding 8,000 square feet will pursue LEED certification. The five residence halls and commons building in the Global Neighborhood are each over 30,000 square feet and achieved LEED Silver certification. This demonstrates Elon's commitment to sustainable design and construction practices.
