#### **Finishing the Fall Semester**

As you know, fall semester exams will happen remotely from Nov. 30 - Dec. 4. Here is some advice from the Koenigsberger Learning Center that you can give your student to help them finish the semester successfully.

Before the exam begins:

- 1. Calm your mind and body: Get yourself into your exam mode, relaxed but prepared.
- 2. Eat something: Enough to keep your blood sugar steady but not enough that you feel sluggish.
- 3. Give yourself time: Enough to get mentally and physically ready and not feel rushed.
- 4. Think through how you will answer the following: How will I choose an answer when I can't make an educated guess? What will I do when I encounter an item I am not sure of? What will I do if I am running out of time?

- 1. Check your computer ahead of time: Make sure Wi-Fi connection is available and that the computer is working and you don't have any access problems.
- 2. Set up for success: Find a good, quiet spot to test and make sure you have turned off all distractions. Get what you need and have at the ready: Computer, power cord, scrap paper and writing utensil if needed.
- 3. Make sure you understand test guidelines: Check time and date. How long do you have to complete the exam? What do you do after it is complete?
- 4. Practice good time management: Don't stay on one question too long. Set a timer to alert you 10 minutes prior to the deadline so you know how much time you have remaining.
- 5. Technical problems: Take screenshots and notify the instructor right away.
- 6. Check your work: Check and recheck your work before submission.

After the exam is over:

- 1. Reflect on what went well during the exam and on what areas of the exam were most challenging. Make a plan to review information that you found challenging.
- 2. When possible, give yourself a break after an exam. Do something relaxing before you begin studying for your next exam.
- 3. Do your best to avoid obsessing over individual questions: Remind yourself that the exam is done and you performed to the best of your abilities.
