


Do you think the job market has gotten better, stayed about the same, or gotten worse since President Trump took office in January?





What letter grade would you give the current <u>national economy</u> of the United States?





What letter grade would you give the current state economy of North Carolina?





Compared to this point last year, are you more or less confident in the financial situation of you and your immediate family?







In your opinion, what has been the impact on the national economy from the Trump administration's approach to immigration enforcement?




In your opinion, what has been the impact on North Carolina's economy from the reduction in federal spending, number of federal employees, elimination of research grants and other government activities?







Do you approve or disapprove of the job Donald Trump is doing as President of the United States?











Do you approve or disapprove of the job Josh Stein is doing as Governor of North Carolina?









Do you approve or disapprove of how the North Carolina General Assembly is doing its job?















Which party do you want to control the U.S. Senate after the 2026 elections?





Which party do you want to control the U.S. House of Representatives after the 2026 elections?





How much have you heard about Roy Cooper, a Democratic candidate for U.S. Senator from North Carolina?





How much have you heard about Michael Whatley, a Republican candidate for U.S. Senator from North Carolina?










How should the state government change its healthcare spending in response to federal cuts to Medicaid spending?














How concerned are you about getting access to vaccines that you would like to receive?







Thinking back to the pandemic, overall, would you say the state of North Carolina's rules and restrictions around coronavirus were too restrictive, not restrictive enough or about right?





How much do you support or oppose state income taxes being lowered if it meant that state sales taxes were increased to make up the difference?





How much do you support or oppose state income taxes being lowered if it meant that the state government offered fewer services to make up the difference?





METHODOLOGY

Sponsoring organization and questionnaire design: Elon University Poll

Fieldwork: YouGov

Interview dates: Sept. 23-Oct 1, 2025

Target population: North Carolina adults, age 18 and older

Sample size: 800

Margin of error: +/-4.24 % (adjusted for weights)

Survey mode: Online, web-based survey, self-administered with online panels Panelists: This poll utilizes a non-probability sample. All YouGov panelists have

been active panelists for 30 days or longer.

YouGov interviewed 907 18+ year-old residents of North Carolina who were then matched down to a sample of 800 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The sampling frame was constructed by stratified sampling from a North Carolina subset of the 2023 American Community Survey (ACS) 1-year sample with selection within strata by weighted sampling with replacements (using the person weights on the public use file).

The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and home ownership. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and poststratified according to these deciles.

The weights were then post-stratified on home ownership, 2020 and 2024 presidential vote choice as well as a four-way stratification of gender, age (4categories), race (4-categories), and education (4-categories), and a two-way stratification of race (4-categories), and education (4-categories), to produce the final weight.

The marginal distribution of 2020 presidential vote choice and its demographic interlockings were based on a politically representative "modeled frame" of US adults, using the 2019 American Community Survey (ACS) public use microdata file, public voter file records, the 2020 Current Population Survey (CPS) Voting and Registration supplements, the 2020 National Election Pool (NEP) exit poll, and the 2020 CES surveys, including demographics and 2020 presidential vote. The marginal

distribution of 2024 vote choice was based on official ballot counts compiled by the

University of Florida Election Labs and CNN. Demographic interlockings for 2024 vote

choice were based on CNN's 2024 Exit Polls.

Data Quality checks: We used three attention checks, one open end, one grid item and one multiple select. We used all three in combination when cleaning the data removing anyone who failed two or more attention checks. We also removed the top 2% of speeders and skippers from the data.

Critical Mass for Crosstabs: All crosstabs must have at least 60 unweighted respondents per column in order to report their results. Every crosstab result reported in the release appears in the crosstabs.

Transparency: The Elon University Poll is a charter member of the Transparency Initiative, a program created by the American Association for Public Opinion Research (AAPOR) in 2014 to educate polling firms on ways to better share how they collect and interpret their information. The Elon Poll's voluntary participation in this initiative signifies a willingness to clearly state in its reports how questions were asked, in what order, who funded the poll and then conducted it, and a

definition of the population under study, among other details
