

Share your thoughts with young people from global-good project Imagining the Internet at IGF 2018 in Paris!

You are invited to visit briefly with a team of young people from the non-profit, civil society organization the Imagining the Internet Center. They are asking IGF participants to share their thoughts about the Internet in brief video interviews. **Imagining the Internet** is a Webby Honors-winning project that often partners with Pew Research. We ask people to share their views in order to expose issues and potential impacts, to inform policy, and to create a public record that tells the story of the Internet's evolution. You will be asked these questions:

Question One: The Best New Digital Development? So many new technologies are emerging today – artificial intelligence, blockchain, cryptocurrencies, augmented and virtual reality, quantum and edge computing ... What new digital technologies will create the best opportunities for a better world for all over the next 10 years – why? Discuss this.

Question Two: The One Key Internet Challenge Today? This year's IGF theme is "Internet of Trust." Trust on the Internet has fallen due to concerns about cybersecurity, crime, fake news, privacy & data rights, digital & economic divides, and emerging technologies such as AI. What is the ONE most important Internet Challenge or Issue globally today and why? - Discuss this challenge. What action can be taken to address it?

Question Three: How Can We Enhance Global Cooperation in the Digital Age? This is the 70th anniversary of the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights. The UN High-Level Panel on Digital Cooperation is working to identify values, principles and mechanisms to assure that human rights, trust and inclusive participation are advanced globally - what do you suggest? What will bring people together for better cooperation on digital issues – what mechanisms might be employed? And should the UN Declaration of Human Rights be updated to include DIGITAL rights?

Question Four: The Future in a Nutshell? Take a few seconds to briefly describe the future of the Internet in a few words or one sentence. "It will be..."
